Dr Deborah Gleeson is a Lecturer in the School of Psychology and Public Health at La Trobe University in Australia. Her research focuses on the intersection between trade policy and public health and she has published a large number of peer-reviewed papers, submissions and technical briefs and opinion pieces on this topic.
